

ALUM RESPONDS TO ARTICLE

The 2020 edition of *The Fountain*, the annual alumnae magazine, should have arrived at your home by now. I would like to thank **Elena Corie Marchisotto '63** for writing in and offering her reaction to **Joyce Thomas's '64** article, "Why an Old Alum Prefers the New Fontbonne" and submitted this response.

"It was with some sadness that I read Joyce Thomas's essay describing her education at Fontbonne Hall in the 1960s. My experience at the Academy was indeed not at all what she described. The message I consistently heard during my four years (1959-1963) in attendance was that "I can". Indeed, I was encouraged to pursue mathematics at a time when women were barely visible in the field, and, even more importantly, to develop skills that enabled me to become a life-long learner. My education at Fontbonne prepared me for a career, as well as for life. I graduated from Manhattanville College of the Sacred Heart with a major in mathematics, earned a Ph.D. from New York University, and worked as a professor and researcher in the field for decades. I am now an emerita professor, still pursuing my research. I also continue to appreciate music, literature, art, history, and the life sciences, thankful for the exposure to them at Fontbonne in the 60s.

While I believe it was not the author's intention, I am concerned that her essay does a disservice to the reputation of the school and to all those who graduated from it. I am certain that there are many alumnae, like myself, who believe that their education at Fontbonne Hall Academy was indeed one that empowered them, and one of which the school should continue to be proud."
